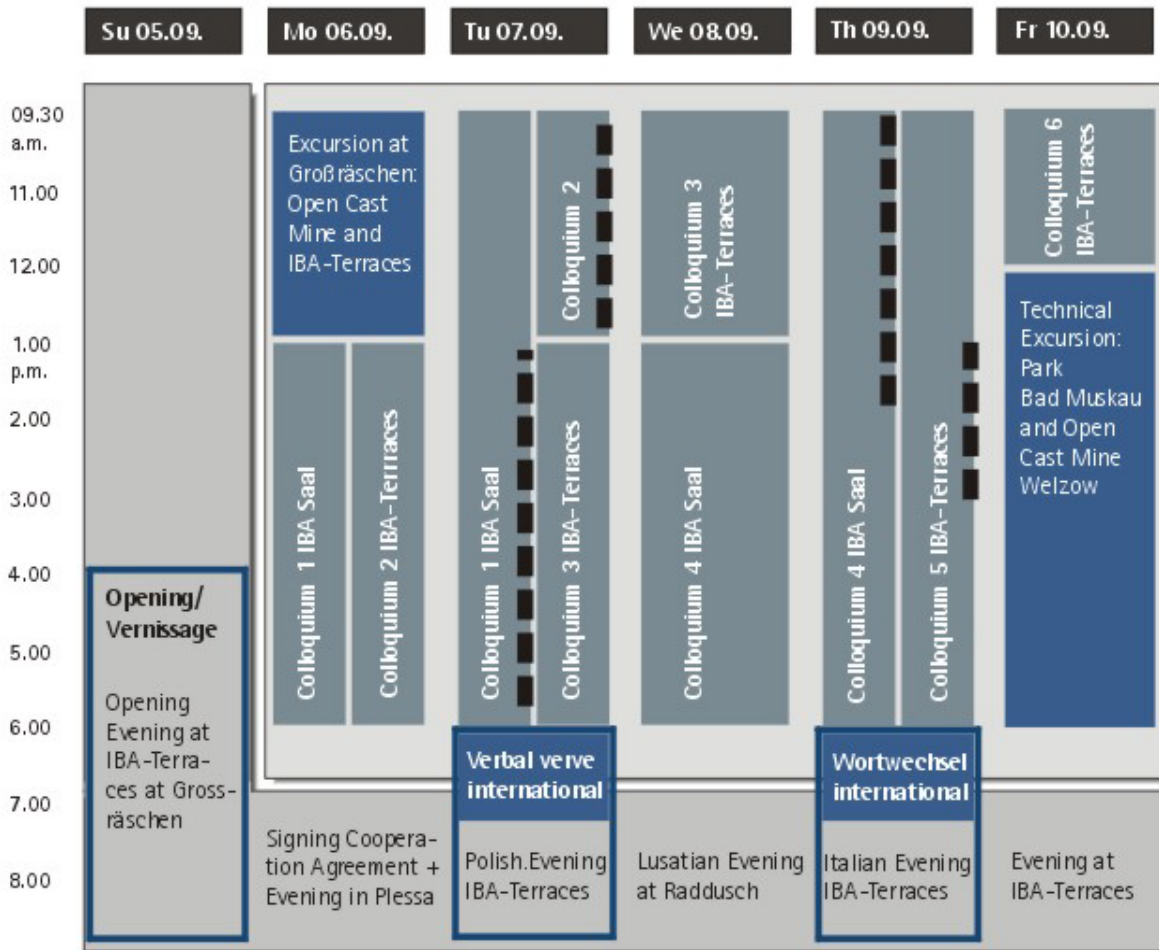





Colloquium 6: Space meets density – Sociology and environment during urban conversion

Practice transfer on housing restructuring and landscape under special consideration of sociology and environment. Objective of the one-week design workshop „STUDIO2: Space meets density“ is the discussion of sustainable uses of existing housing areas and development of new housing models in industrially transformed cultural landscapes. The event will focus both on discussing the restructuring of existing housing estates in industrial landscapes under urban planning and architectural views and on presenting innovations in housing conversion and space utilisation.
