List of the sites awarded between 1990 and 2014 with their geographical location, a brief description and the person or institution entrusted with the seal designed and signed by Carlo Scarpa for the garden-cemetery at San Vito d'Altivole (Treviso).

1990, Sítio Santo Antônio da Bica

Barra de Guaratiba, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. House and landscape laboratory of *Roberto Burle Marx* (1909-1994).

1991, Special Prize to Rosario Assunto

Italian philosopher (1915-1994), a leading figure in the debate over landscape and garden issues.

1992, Sissinghurst

Kent, United Kingdom. House and garden of Vita Sackville-West and Harold Nicolson. *Pamela Schwerdt* (1931-2009), *Sibylle Kreutzberger*, gardeners from 1959 to 1990.

1993, Désert de Retz

Île de France, France. Garden created by Monsieur de Monville between 1774 and 1789. *Olivier Choppin de Janvry*.

1994, Avenue of Heroes

Tirgu Jiu, Oltenia, Romania. Work of Constantin Brancusi (1876-1957). *Ministry for Culture of Romania*.

1995, Forest of Memory

Enskede, Stockholm, Sweden. Cemetery, work of Erik Gunnar Asplund (1885-1940) and Sigurd Lewerentz (1885-1975). *Stockholm City Council, Department of Cemeteries*.

1996, The Fresneda

Spain, near the Escorial. Country estate of Philip II (1527-1598). *José Luis Aguirre Borrell* (1923-2002), owner; *Luis Cervera Vera* (1914-1998), art historian.

1997, Dessau-Wörlitzer Gartenreich

Germany. The gardens of Franz von Anhalt (1751-1817). Garden Administration of Kulturstiftung Dessau-Wörlitz.

1998, Cerca do Mosteiro de Tibães

Minho, Portugal, near the city of Braga. Benedictine monastery. *Instituto Português do Património Arquitectónico*.

1999, Cusa quarries

Sicily, Italy. Stone quarries for the temples of Selinunte, V century BC. *Vincenzo Tusa* (1920-2009), Superintendent BAA.

2000, The Agdal

Marrakech, Morocco. Orchard and garden founded by Almohads in the V century $^{\mathrm{BC}}$. *Domaines Agricoles Royaux*.

2001, Castelvecchio

Verona, Italy. Restored as a museum on the initiative of Licisco Magagnato (1921-1987) and to the design of Carlo Scarpa (1906-1978). *Verona City Council, Management of Museums*.

2002, The Castle Gardens, Prague

Czech Republic. Restored on the initiative of Tomáš Garrigue Masaryk (1850-1937) and to the design of Jože Plečnik (1872-1957). *Garden Administration of Prague Castle*.

2003, The paths opposite the Athens Acropolis

Athens, Greece. Work of Dimitris Pikionis (1887-1968). Agni Pikionis.

2004, Kongenshus Mindepark

Jutland, Denmark. Farmers' memorial, work of Carl Theodor Sørensen (1893-1979) and Hans Georg Skovgaard (1898-1969). *Hedeselskab/Heath Society*.

2005, Deir Abu Maqar

Wadi en-Natrun, Egypt. Coptic monastery of Saint Macarius (IV century) refounded in the XX century by the monk *Matta El Meskin* (1959-2006).

2006, Val Bavona

Canton Ticino, Switzerland. A mountain site and community. Fondazione Valle Bavona.

2007, Jasenovac Memorial Site

Slavonia, Croatia. Memorial site on the banks of the River Sava. Work of Bogdan Bogdanović (1922-2010). *Spomen područje Jasenovac*.

2008, Museumplein

Amsterdam, Netherlands. Designed and created (1992-1999) by Sven-Ingvar Andersson (1927-2007). *Municipal Administration of Amsterdam Oud-Zuid*.

2009, The Otaniemi Chapel

Espoo, Helsinki, Finland. Work of Kaija (1920-2001) and Heikki Siren (1918-2013). *Federation of Espoo Parishes*.

2010, Dura Europos

Syria, the middle stretch of the Euphrates. Ruins and remains of an ancient fortified city (IV century BC-III AD). *General Directorate of Syrian Antiquities and Museums*.

2011, Taneka Beri

Village in Atakora, Benin. A Tangba community settlement since the XVIII century. *Municipality of Copargo*.

2012, Bosco di Sant'Antonio

Abruzzo, Italy. Woodland pasture, "difesa" woods. Municipality of Pescocostanzo.

2013, Skrúður, Núpur

Iceland, Dýrafjörður. Garden and school created (1909) by Sigtryggur Guðlaugsson (1862-1959). *Framkvæmdasjóður Skrúðs*.

2014, Osmače and Brežani

Srebrenica, Bosnia and Herzegovina. Small villages up on the plateau, where revive agriculture and togetherness. *Muhamed Avdić* and *Velibor Rankić*.
